- #929A. JACQUINET-DUMEZ “Dialogie” Blanc de Noirs Premier Cru (Champagne, France)** 132
• Pinot Meunier 80% • Pinot Noir 20%
Produced in one of the best (and smallest) areas of Champagne, this Premier Cru spends about 2 years on the lees adding to the weight and texture. Notes of ripe stone fruits and a bread finish.
- #951A. ANDRÉ HEUCQ “Heritage” Extra Brut (Vallée de la Marne (Champagne), France)** 136
• Chardonnay 40% • Pinot Noir 30% • Pinot Meunier 30%
Aged for 60 months on the lees, offering a bit of weight on the tongue. Golden apple, honey and black tea across the palate.
- #959B. GAMET “Rive Droite” Brut Grand Cru (Champagne, France)** 140
• Pinot Meunier 85% • Pinot Noir 15%
One of the few women-run wineries in France and even more rare in the Champagne region, this grower champagne is truly elegant. Bright and lively ripe tropical fruits with a round mouthfeel.
- #920A. R. DUMONT ET FILS Brut Tradition (Champagne, France)** 140
• Pinot Noir 90% • Chardonnay 10%
This is a blend of vintages up to 5 years old. It is aged after blending for an additional 2 years on the lees. Bone dry and earthy with a unique complexity only available after the blending of the library of vintages.
- #987B. PEHU SIMONET “Face Nord” Brut Grand Cru (Montagne de Reims (Champagne), France)** 154
• Pinot Noir 70% • Chardonnay 30%
A blend of wines going back to 2005 from a fourth-generation grower-winemaker. Genuinely complex, with notes of white flowers, cherry, and a hint of plum.
- #917A. MARION-BOSSER Brut Tradition Premier Cru (Hautvillers (Champagne), France)** 168
• Chardonnay 80% • Pinot Noir 20%
The classic bread note found in this region is truly present in this wine. Fresh apple and white flowers from the aroma through the finish keep this very dry bubbly drawing your attention.
- #916B. MARION-BOSSER Blanc de Blancs Extra-Brut Premier Cru (Champagne, France)** 175
• Pinot Noir
Simply wonderful with the lively natural acidity of the chardonnay on the tip of the tongue. It then develops in the mid palate with notes of toast and hints of almonds.
- #926A. PASACAL DOQUET “Coeur de Terroir” Premier Cru (Champagne, France)** 190
• Chardonnay
A flashy bouquet and traditional champagne palate of ginger, anise and wild blueberry.

- #964. **GABERNIK 23 (Slovenia)** 71
• Rumeni Muskat
Something fun! Lemon juice, lychee, jasmine and rose nips. Very food-friendly!
- #962. **BLOOMER CREEK VINEYARD (Hector (Finger Lakes), New York)** 72
• Gewurtztraminer
Both an orange & pet nat. Citrus and baking spice are in perfect balance with the floral note.
- #960. **CHATEAU LA COLOMBIERE "Bande de Brutes" (Fronton, France)** 83
• Bouysselet 50% • Muscat 30% • Macabeu 20%
Bruised apple, ripe peaches, & flowers in bloom dancing around a little bit of barnyard.
- #963A. **FAZI BATTAGLIA "Gatto Brio aka 'The Pet'" (Marche, Italy)** 90
• Verdicchio
The Battaglia family has been making wine since 1949 and this pet nat shows the experience they have working with the native grape varieties. Notes of peaches and a touch of white pepper are brought to the forefront of this wonderfully bubbly pet nat.
- #967. **APHROS "Phaunus" (Lima Valley (Vinho Verde), Portugal)** 90
• Loureiro
Macerated briefly on the skins, green apple, pear and bright minerality. Fresh sourdough on the finish.
- #936. **VINO VOLTA (Swan Valley, Australia) Grenache** 96
• Grenache
Super fruity with mulberry & raspberry. The palate is creamy and finishes with a distinct cider tang.

- #950. **A.A. BADENHORST "Secateurs Riviera" (Swartland, S. Africa)** 65
• Chenin Blanc 85% • Semillon 8% • Colombar 7%
Honeysuckle, flint, orange blossoms and white flowers.
- #952. **MEINKLANG "Mulatschak" (Neusiedlerse, Austria)** 80
• Welschriesling • Pinot Gris • Traminer
Aromatic notes of peach, rhubarb and lime finishing with fresh clementine and a salty minerality.
- #997B. **FLORIAN MATHIEU "La Nature Au-Dessus" (Lansargues (Occitanie), France)** 81
• Grenache Blanc 40% • Roussanne 30% • Marsanne 30%
Pale salmon/gold color with aromas of green apple, pear and peach. On the palate the a bit of orange zest helps to elevate and balance the apple notes.
- #940A. **FAZI BATTAGLIA "Gatto Arancio" (Marche, Italy)** 88
• Verdicchio 100%
This is a very cool wine. It is fermented with some whole cluster bunches in the vat to allow additional skin contact and a bit of semi-carbonic liveliness. Bright floral acidity and dry finish.
- #944. **CARUSO & MININI "Arancino" Bianco Macerato (Sicily, Italy)** 88
• Catarrato
This winery is well over 100 years old and originally grew grapes to sell to Marsala producers. This wine however takes that traditionally boring, high acid grape varietal and turns it into something heavenly. 20 days of skin contact brings forth a touch of baking spice and acts more like a red wine on the palate.
- #968. **YETTI & THE KOKONUT "Hipster Juice" (Tanunda (Riverland), S. Australia)** 89
• Doradillo 40% • Zinfandel 25% • Red Sémillon 20% • Cabernet Franc 15%
Bright, refreshing, and highly flavorful. Full of red berries, spice, and palate-cleansing acidity. Each varietal was fermented and aged separately using different techniques to bring out their best.
- #974C. **PFNEISZL "Zefir" Bianco Macerato (Sopron, Hungary)** 92
• Viognier • Muscat
Don't worry if you haven't heard of this grape; most people haven't. One taste however and you'll never forget the variety. Flavors of honey, elderflower, melon and peach. The finish brings some real acidity to the mix and keeps those fruit notes in check.
- #954. **CONSTANT CRUSH "Orange Crush" (Forest Grove (Willamette Valley AVA), Oregon)** 94
• Muscat • Pinot Gris • Riesling
Wildly aromatic, loads of citrus and orchard fruits with hints of jasmine and fresh ginger.
- #956. **SWERWER "Rooi-Groen" (Swartland, Western Cape, South Africa) Semillon** 98
• Semillon
Copper in color (from light skin contact) and flavors of nectarine, fig and red apple, lightly tannic.
- #971. **TWO SHEPHERDS (Russian River (Sonoma Valley AVA), California)** 105
• Pinot Gris
Fresh tangerine, peach and honeysuckle on the palate. Balanced and approachable

- #957. MICHEL NARTZ "Frankstein" Alsace Grand Cru (Dambach la Ville, France) 115
• Pinot Gris
A pleasantly perfumed, wild flowers, orange blossoms, candied peaches.
- #969A. CASA DO JOA "Alto" (Trás-os-Montes, Portugal) 115
• Wild Field Blend
19 months in French oak and extended time with the skins. Quince, pear and chestnut notes.
- #914. VIGNOBLES PUEYO "Hellébore" (Bordeaux (Left-Bank), France) 195
• Semillon
Fermented and aged on its skins in terra-cotta. Candied lemon, toasted hazelnuts and burnt orange.

- #903. **GEYER WINE CO. (Barossa Valley, Australia)** 78
• Grenache • Cinsault • Pinot Meunier
Deeper red in color than many rose options, tart fruit, juicy strawberries with an herbal finish.
- #904. **KONPIRA MARU "MK Rosé" (Kilmore (Victoria), Australia)** 87
• Pinot Noir • Pinot Meunier • Chardonnay
Tons of wild strawberry with a hint of rosemary, thyme and other baking herbs lingering across the palate.
- #961A. **PODERE ANIMA MUNDI "Psychedelic Train" (Tuscany, Italy)** 90
• Canaiolo
Super juicy and lighter bodied red with the true definition of Glou-Glou (easy drinking and fun) at it's heart. Raspberry and blueberry across the palate.
- #908. **CONSTANT CRUSH WINE (Willamette Valley, Oregon)** 94
• Mencia • Cabernet Franc
Fragrant rose and blue fruits with bright red fruit full of juiciness. A ripe and intensely crushable wine!
- #909. **CHATEAU PRADEAUX "Bandol" (Bandol, France)** 110
• Mourvedre • Cinsault
This is not a frivolous wine. Powerfully structured and vibrant. Lush, red berry flavors, stone fruit, and orange zest, with a fragrant spice & dried herb bouquet that incorporates hints of lavender, rosemary, thyme and a subtle hint of white pepper.
- #905. **CORNELISSEN "Susucaru" (Mt. Etna (Sicily), Italy)** 124
• Nerello Mascalese
A crunchy, red fruit rosé! Rich and creamy with notes of dried rose, pink grapefruit and pomegranate.
- #988B. **FINCA PARERA "Fins Als Kullons!" (Sant Llorenç d'Hortons, Catalonia)** 125
• Sumoll • Garnatxa Blanca • Xarel•lo
This liter bottle is one of the most sought after for any natural Spanish wine lover, period. Two younger winemakers, a grumpy dad and a seemingly perfect plot of land allows this juicy red to soar to the top of so many lists.
- #910. **PACINA "Rosato" (Tuscany, Italy) Sangiovese** 130
• Sangiovese
Serious minerality, pepper and dark currant, secondary notes of dried plum, cedar & dark berries.

• Bouysselet • Macabeu • Muscat
Demeter certified winery. Aromas of sunflower and dandelion with a dry herbaceous finish.

spanish compositions

- #921. PARTIDA CREUS "VN" (Catalonia, Spain) 100
• Xarel•lo • Moscatel • Garnacha • Parellada
Light and crunchy, white stone fruits, white flowers and mediterranean herbs. A touch of brine.
- #935. DOMAINE DE CLOVALLON "Les Aurièges" Pays d'Oc (Catalonia, Spain) 105
• Chardonnay • Petit Manseng • Riesling • Viognier • Rousanne • Clairette • Petite Arvine
Light and crunchy, white stone fruits, white flowers and mediterranean herbs. A touch of brine.

- #932. LENKEY PINCESZET "Flow" (Màd, Hungary) 87
• Furmint 65% • Harslevelü 35% • Sárgamuskotály 5%
Straw colored with notes of lemon meringue, vanilla, flavors of green apple and bright lemon zest.
- #941. BLANKBOTTLE "Nothing To Declare" (Western Cape, S. Africa) 89
• Marsanne 40% • Grenache Gris 26% • Viognier 18%
Mineral aroma with hints of herbaceous spices. Full bodied with a balanced acidity & bitterness.
- #978. CHATEAU DELUXE "Edelzwicker" (McMinnville (Willamette Valley), Oregon) 94
• Pinot Blanc 72% • Riesling 28%
Peach and baking spice, bright acidity on the palate with notes of citrus, apricot and peach. Unfiltered!

- #975A. **OLD WESTMINSTER (Westminster, Maryland)** 90
Lime zest, white peach and pink grapefruit. A hint of granite, and starfruit on the palate.

altesse

- #989. **DOMAINE LUPIN "Frangy 2013" Roussette de Savoie (Savoie, France)** 84
A classic varietal. Ripe orchard fruit and balancing notes of lemon citrus, hazelnut and lemon curd. Excellent with sharp cheeses, asian spices, and fattier seafood. chardonnay
- #993A. **DOMAINE CREUSSEROME "Viré Clessé" (Macon (Bourgogne), France)** 84
Classic Burgundy white produced by Stephane and Lucie Guillemin. Hints of honeydew melon, butterscotch and a hint of tropical fruits. A clean minerality in the finish typical of the region.
- #945. **CRYSTALLUM WINES "The Agnes" (Western Cape, S. Africa)** 110
White peach, papaya and lemongrass on the nose. Butterscotch and lemon curd, pleasant salinity.
- #939. **OCHOTA BARRELS "Slint" (Adelaide Hills, S. Australia)** 130
Granny smith apples and honey suckle spice with lemon curd and beeswax on the finish.

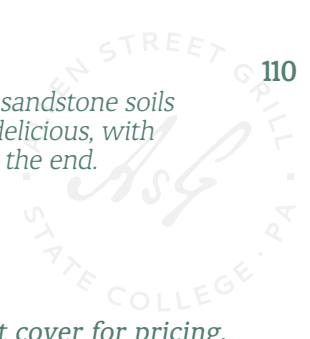
chardonnay

- #934A. **ARNAUD BOUE Hautes-Cotes de Nuits (Bourgogne, France)** 102
Aged for just under 15 months in French oak with only 600 bottles produced each vintage. A mineral forward wine at the beginning leads into more tropical fruit and passionfruit in the finish. Dry and just delectable.
- #983. **SCAR OF THE SEA Bassi Vineyard (Santa Barbara, California)** 135
A favorite of ours, lemon curd, chalk, and white flowers with seared orange and a citrusy finish.
- #966. **DUMOL "Wester Reach" (Russian River Valley, California)** 140
Fresh and mineral-forward with a bright citrus acidity. A deep and weighty texture with honeysuckle and green apple notes and a long-lasting finish.

chenin blanc

- #972C. **CHRISTOPHE THORIGNY "Sec" Vouvray (Parcay-Meslay (Loire Valley), France)** 88
Severe pruning of the vines makes this wine super complex and concentrated. The wine is fermented only in stainless steel to present as much of the ripe stone fruits that come from this variety in this region across the palate. A lasting acidity in the finish.
- #928A. **LOURENS FAMILY WINES "Skuinskap" Steen (Piekenierskloof, S. Africa)** 110
Such a fun wine, not least because it comes from 50 year old vines planted on sandstone soils almost half a mile in elevation. The super special reason it's fun is because it's delicious, with flavors of Williams pear, white pepper, a hint of salinity, and a touch of herb at the end.

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single-varietal whites

gruner veltliner

- #985A. GEYERHOF “StockWerk” (Kremstal, Austria) 102
The first mention of this farm goes all the way back to 1135 AD, though the vines growing this wine are much more current than that! Spiced apple, classic Gruner black pepper and minerality.

jacquere

- #994. MAISON DES ARDOISIÈRES Silice Blanc (Savoie, France) Jacquere 86
Zesty lemon confit with just a touch of white peach enlivened by crushed stone and almond flowers

marsanne

- #907B. DOMAINE BENOIT ROSEAU “Sur le Quartz” (Saint-Joseph, Rhone, France) 110
Aged for 10 months in French oak and presenting with notes of apricot and honeysuckle. This is a surprisingly dense and weighty wine that so embodies the northern rhone white wines.

pinot grigio

- #911D. VIA ALPINA (Friuli (Veneto), Italy) 48
A crisp, clean slate finish as you would expect from any quality wine of this varietal. Delicate and satisfying, with notes of green apple and pear.

riesling

- #991B. KARTHAUSERHOF “Bruno” (Eitelsbach (Mosel), Germany) 74
This dry Riesling is full of vibrant peach, lime zest and a subtle hint of the classic Mosel petrol and thyme notes that makes this region so special.

- #997A. ROBERT EYMAEL “Monchhof” (Urzig (Mosel), Germany) 80
Farmed on one the steepest vineyards in all of Germany, they actually need to use some rock climbing equipment for harvest. Green apple and grapefruit acidity is perfectly balanced by fully ripe sweetness.

- #977. THE ELEMENT WINERY (Arkport (Finger Lakes), New York) 90
Bursting with acidity, balanced by earthiness. Loads of lemon and lime zest, green apple and pear.

- #984B. WEINGUT ÖKONOMIERAT BEBHOLZ (Pfalz, Germany) 90
This dry Riesling is full of minerality with plenty of citrus, apricot and peach to go around.

- #995A. MARTIN & ANNA ARNDORFER “Strasser Weinberge” (Kamptal, Austria) 98
Growing in granite soils & fermented in neutral barrels. Dry with notes of jasmine, peach and apricot.

- #955. ODINSTAL (Pfalz, Germany) 125
High toned herbal nose, with ripe flavors of quince and lychee. Zingy star fruit finish.

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single-varietal whites

romorantin

- #949A. PHILIPPE TESSIER “La Porte Dorée” (Cour Cheverny (Loir-et-Cher), France)** 122
It is hard to come across this producers wines for both the high demand, but also the very low yields coming from the vineyards. Many vintages have left them with 20 percent of the total production that is possible due to extreme weather events. A slight oxidative note with lemon zest, dried herbs and a touch of honeysuckle.
- #958A. PHILIPPE TESSIER “Les Sables” (Cour Cheverny (Loir-et-Cher), France)** 126
A blend of cement and oak aging allowing this native white grape to be a liquid picture of the terroir. Slight honey, quince and white flowers with a touch of mint in the finish.

roussanne

- #982. SITE WINES Stolpman Vineyards (Ballard Canyon (Santa Barbara), California)** 145
White currants, licorice, and toasted nuts on the nose. Full bodied with a healthy dose of oak.

sauvignon blanc

- #928B. DOMAINE DE BEL AIR Pouilly Fume (Pouilly sur Loire (Loire Valley), France)** 96
The vineyards around Pouilly sur Loire yield this crisp expression of Sauvignon Blanc. Dry, fresh, and fruity, with a signature gunflint nose owing to the terroir. Lively, lasting finish and subdued acidity — killer with seafood!

verdejo

- #924. MICROBIO WINES “Litrona: Verdejo” (Castilla y Leon, Spain)** 115
Organic grapes from 150 year old vines. Delightfully wild, with soft fruity notes and some serious tropical vibes!

verdicchio

- #980A. UMANI RONCHI “CaSal di Serra” (Osimo (Castelli di Jesi), Italy)** 84
This varietal always has a nutty quality to it and this is not different. It offers up so much more than that with a touch of golden apple, wild flowers and just a hint of peach.

xarel•lo

- #919. FINCA PARERA “Litrona: Xarel•lo” (Castilla y Leon, Spain)** 115
A little hazy in the glass, not too fruity, super light bodied, and a tad wild on the palate.

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multiple-varietal reds

french compositions

- #243. **MASD DES FLAUZIERES “Séguret” Cuvée Julien (Bas Rhône, France)** 68
• Grenache • Syrah
A note of worn leather and medium body make this a perfect choice for any game or red meats.
- #340. **DOMAINE DU CHAPITRE “No. 7” Côtes du Rhône (Saint-Marcel d’Ardèche, France)** 84
• Grenache • Syrah • Mourvedre
Light cedar, spice, and tobacco on the nose, with rich cherry, black currant, vanilla, and a little leather. Aging and fermentation takes place in cement tanks, so oak influence is absent and the fruit is allowed room to shine.
- #902. **AGNES ET RENE MOSSE “Bangarang” (Loire Valley, France)** 85
• Cabernet Franc • Pineau d’Aunis
A delicious, easy-going fruit bomb brimming with white pepper, wild strawberries, and a touch of tea leaves. Lighter bodied and not overly serious - best enjoyed for the fun of it and with friends.
- #525A. **STEPHANE OGIER “Les Temps Est Venu” Côtes du Rhône (Ampuis, France)** 88
• Grenache 60% • Syrah 40%
A surprising amount of tannins in this bottle with lots of ripe dark cherry and worn leather. The warmer weather from the region makes sure the ripeness pushes through on the tongue.
- #524A. **ELIAN DA ROS “Le Vignoble d’Eliau” Côtes du Marmandais (Cocumont, France)** 90
• Cabernet Franc • Merlot • Syrah
Something special with a terroir-driven mineral backbone and 18 months spent in French oak fouders. Slightly sweet in the mid palate with very gentle tannins and balanced acidity.
- #491A. **DOMAINE DES SABLONNETTES “Ménard le Rouge” (Côteau de Layon, France)** 92
• Cabernet Franc 30% • Grolleau 30% • Chenin 20% • Gamay 10% • Cabernet Sauvignon 10%
The earthy quality here is a trademark of Sablonnettes wines and often the grape vines are just one of a multitude of plants grown in the vineyard. Fallen leaves, plum and black cherry.
- #431. **DOMAINE PHILIPPE TESSIER Cheverny Rouge (Cour Cheverny (Loir-et-Cher), France)** 98
• Gamay • Pinot Noir • Côt
Charbono-like quality, yet juicy, fresh lip-smacking fruit is turned up a notch by Mexican chocolate.
- #414A. **CHATEAU VILLARS Fronsac (Saillans (Bordeaux), France)** 104
• Merlot 81% • Cabernet Franc 15% • Cabernet Sauvignon 4%
A wonderful, Merlot-forward Bordeaux, similar in style to it’s neighbor, Pomerol. Chalky clay soils have an outsized influence. Soft and fruity, with ripe blackberries, cherries, and a little leather.
- #230. **BRUNO DUCHENE “Odin” Rouge (Collioure (Roussillon), France)** 125
• Syrah • Tempranillo • Carignan
Rustic, natural smoke, wild berry, floral and green. Medium bodied with moderate tannins.
- #472A. **MAISON LA BERTHAUDE Tradition 2021 Châteauneuf-du-Pape (Berthaud, France)** 128
• Grenache 80% • Syrah 15% • Mourvèdre 5%
The vines are primarily around 25 years old, though some are over 100 years old. The dried blackberry and allspice are balanced by the fresh ripe red berries of the younger vines.
- #241. **CHÂTEAU MOULIN DE TRICOT Haut Médoc (Gironde (Bordeaux), France)** 130
• Cabernet Sauvignon 70% • Merlot 30%
Great balance of ripe fruit and firm tannins. Black fruits and cassis with earth and spicy undertones.

- #576. **DOMAINE DES TOURS** Vin de Pays de Vaucluse (Sarrians (Rhône Valley), France) 190
• Grenache • Counoise • Syrah • Cinsault
Aromas of earth, tobacco, and dark red fruit and is medium-bodied and well-structured.
- #220. **DOMAINE SANTA DUC** Les Hautes Garrigues (Gigondas (Rhône Valley), France) 205
• Grenache 50% • Mourvèdre 50%
From the region of Gigondas, velvety tannins, full bodied with intense black currants, dark cocoa, leather and oak

italian compositions

- #665. **VINO DI ANNA** “Palmentino” Rosso (Catania (Sicily), Italy) 105
• Nerello Mascalese • Nerello Cappuccio • Alicante
Light bodied, juicy, and energetic, though structured by an undertone of volcanic minerality. Flavors of cranberry, blood orange, and a savory umami quality. Great with charcuterie.
- #480. **RADIKON** “RS” Rosso Sasa (Friuli-Venezia Giulia, Italy) 120
• Merlot 75% • Pignolo 25%
Soft & round, with a deep mix of ripe red fruits and a delightful herbal, almost saline finish. There is an unexpected depth to this wild and wonderful red from the winemaking legends at Radikon.
- #574. **CASTELLO DEI RAMPOLLA** “Sammarco” Super Tuscan (Greve (Tuscany), Italy) 250
• Cabernet Sauvignon • Merlot • Sangiovese
Sammarco is a very fresh wine with fine aromas of woodland undergrowth and a deep, intense color. It is characterized by distinct aromas of ripe fruit and has a strong concentration of powerful tannins.

spanish compositions

- #295. **D. VENTURA** “Viñas do Burato” (Ribeira Sacra, Spain) 77
• Mencia • Merenzao
Crisp and refreshing with mouthwatering acidity comparable to Beaujolais or Alpine French wines.
- #321. **FINCA PARERA** “Fosc” (Catalonia, Spain) 80
• Sumoll • Syrah • Ull de Llebre
A true wild wine, aromas of hay and barnyard funk, black berry and cherry cola on the palate.
- #463A. **SERNANDE** “Mil Vueltas A Ferreira” (Castilla La Mancha, Spain) 92
• Mencia • Caiño
This wine comes from a super small vineyard of only 250 vines planted in 1940. Aged for ten months in stainless steel tanks after a week of daily foot treading. Bitter underripe cherry, eucalyptus, crafts and raspberry with a balanced tannic finish.

- #301. **OCHOTA BARRELS “Texture Like Sun” (McLaren Vale/Adelaide Hills, S. Australia)** 100
• Pinot Noir 70% • Shiraz 10% • Gewürztraminer 10% • Pinot Meunier 5% • Gamay 5%
Red forest fruits, spice, white pepper and roasted meat. Fine smokey tannins and cassis on the finish.
- #214A. **DIVISION “Division-Village: Béton” (Portland/Willamette Valley, Oregon)** 112
• Cabernet Franc 35% • Côt 32% • Gamay 24% • Cabernet Sauvignon 5% • Pinot Noir 4%

- #221A. **STARGAZER “Rada” (Coal River Valley, Tasmania)** 120
• Pinot Noir 52% • Pinot Meunier 48%
Cranberry and dried orange lead into slightly tart rhubarb. The wine finishes with some savory baking spices and a touch of bitterness found in very ripe cherries.
- #352. **MUSAR “Levantine de Musar” (West Bekaa Valley, Lebanon)** 125
• Cinsault 55% • Tempranillo 35% • Cabernet Sauvignon 10%
Great depth with red and blue fruit aromas, a touch of smoke and tobacco leaf in the finish.

- #350. POPPELVEJ “Sort Sol” (McLaren Vale, S. Australia) 92

Fragrant and floral red fruits on the nose. Relatively young vines yield a fruit-forward Franc.

Dark fruits with a high mineral content, leather, fresh green pepper and a bouquet of red berries.

Originally planted in the 1890s, this site is home to the Cabernet Pfeffer mother block. Its origin is a mystery, but it is spicy and delicious. Light and ethereal with a slight vegetal finish.

cabernet sauvignon

- #259. **MERRIAM VINEYARDS (Russian River Valley, California)** 120
30% new French oak for aging allows the structure and nutty qualities to come through yet allow the intense red fruits and spice that is a hallmark for the Russian River Valley to showcase.
- #434A. **BREA Margarita Vineyard (Paso Robles, California)** 120
A collaboration between renowned natural winemaker Chris Brockway and Tim Elenteny, from T. Elenteny imports. Aged in neutral French oak for 16 months for the classic bold California fruit without being over oaked.
- #566. **PAUL HOBBS (Napa Valley, California)** 300
A decadent and rich wine with notes of chocolate, boysenberry and red currant with silky tannins.
- #569A. **CAYMUS 2020 (Napa Valley, California)** 300
One of the most famous Cabernet Sauvignon brands in the world. Always decadent and a true crowd pleaser here.
- #578. **DUNN VINEYARDS 2019 (Napa Valley, California)** 365
Thirty-two months in 100% new French oak barrels. Notes of graphite, dried herbs and a roundness to the tannin structure. The dark red and blue fruits balance perfectly with the natural earthy quality from the region.
- #567. **DAOU “Soul of a Lion” 2019 (Paso Robles, California)** 435
This wine explodes from the glass with a kaleidoscope of aromas and flavors, including blackberry, blueberry, black currant, dark cherry, sweet tobacco and licorice. Structured, balanced and powerful!
- #579A. **CHAPPELLET “Pritchard Hill” 2019 (Napa Valley, California)** 620

A bright wine with mouthwatering acidity. Cola, strawberry, bing cherries and a touch of rose hip.

Tart bing cherries, wild strawberries, red fruits and wild flowers.

The vines are over 50 years old and are grown on black granite soils. The wine is fermented using carbonic fermentation keeping the result light and juicy. Violets and black berries across the palate with plenty of earthy depth.

Only fermented in old cement tanks with no oak influence at all. The baking spice and violets come to the front of the palate and stick around until the delicate tannin finish.

The ripeness of the region brings this varietal to vibrancy. Dark chocolate, plum, blackberry.
- #555. **EMIDIO PEPE Montepulciano d’Abruzzo 2012 (Abruzzo, Italy)** 400
Very deep red-black when young, with aromas and flavors of barnyard and brambly black fruit. Rustic and powerful. Wild and expressive nose with leather and earthy floral notes. Dark cherry notes!

Only 330 cases produced annually, soft flower notes on the nose with red plums, berries and a touch of earth on the palate. Dry grippy tannins with a full oak presence.
- #552. **ALDO CONTERNO “Bussia” Barolo (Piedmont, Italy)** 250
Old-vine Nebbiolo sings in this classic bottling from the legendary Conterno winery. Elegant & austere.

- #272. **FRANK CORNELISSEN “Susucaru Rosso” (Mt. Etna (Sicily), Italy)** 125
50 year old vines grown on the northern slopes of the Etna volcano. A light bodied yet incredibly textured wine brimming with red plums, pomegranate and mediterranean herbs.
- #232. **VINO DI ANNA “Qvevri Don Alfio” (Filici (Sicily), Italy)** 140
A vegetal nose, earthy on the palate. Cherries, wild berries and plum, a delicate acidity and long finish.

- #231. **LE BRISEAU "Patapon Rouge" (Coteaux du Loir (Loire Valley), France)** 115
Medium-bodied with a zippy acidity, red plums, wild strawberries and wet slate. Carbonic.

The legendary wine maker of this region. Notes of cassis, white pepper, apple and spice. High acidity but bold tannins, exactly what you would want from this region. Perfect with pork or duck.
- #274. **L'ANGE VIN by JEAN-PIERRE ROBINOT “Le Regard” (Jasnieres (Loire Valley), France)** 175
Arguably the master of this varietal and even better yet, one of the best vineyard plots for it in all of France, it’s no wonder it’s so highly rated. White pepper, light bodied and acid driven.

- #392. **POPPELVEJ “Dancing in the Doldrums” (Mclaren Vale, S. Australia)** 87
Pickled watermelon rind on the palate with notes of tart strawberry, thyme & rosemary, Light bodied.
- #400. **KEEP WINES “Young Mill Vineyard” (Napa, California)** 94
Gamay meets pinot noir. Ripe red fruits, violets and roasted coffee beans. Medium bodied.

- #330A. **CASCINA IULI "Nino" (Montaldo di Cerrina Monferrato (Piedmont), Italy)** 118
Slightly floral aroma with hints of baking spice. Medium body and juicy notes throughout. Delicate tannins from fermentation in stainless steel and aging in neutral oak casks.
- #360. **FREDERICK STEVENSON Summertown (Adelaide Hills, Australia)** 120
Tart red cherry, strawberry balsamic like flavors and light fine tannins, a mineral driven wine.
- #291. **SOSIE by SPRING HILL VINEYARDS (Petaluma (Sonoma County), California)** 135
A fruit driven wine brimming with Bing cherries, wild strawberries and forest floor. Earthy undertones and well-balanced acidity.
- #240A. **RAPHAELLE GUYOT "L'Idylle" (Bourgogne Cotes d'Auxerre, France)** 140
A fantastically complex wine with a very subtle oak influence. It has tons of ripe, thick skinned red fruits adding to a supple texture and a full rich finish.
- #430. **MAIL ROAD WINERY (Santa Rita Hills (Santa Barbara), California)** 160
A nose full of dark fruit and dried herbs, black cherry, fresh thyme and peppercorn. A dense and vibrant wine.

Paul Hobbs is one of the most respected wineries in California. This Pinot Noir comes from the Russian river valley and spends 9 months in French oak barrels. Harvested over the course of over 2 weeks to make sure each bunch was perfectly ripe. Notes of pomegranate, dark cherry, a touch of black pepper and herbal sage.
- #560. **MAIL ROAD WINERY Mt Carmel Vineyard (Santa Rita Hills (Santa Barbara), California)** 260
Pure and total sophistication. Aromatically intense but light on its feet, sweet berry fruit, rose petal, lavender and spice run through this fresh juice.
- #330. **ARNAUD BOUE Nuits-Saint-Georges (Bourgogne, France)** 245
Cherries and strawberries with matured leather, truffle and notes of macerated fruits. Well built and well balanced with a long finish. Cream of the crop.

- #433. **VIGNERONS LES MATHENY "Arbois Poulsard" (Jura, France)** 150
Red fruits and a balanced acidity. Tobacco, cranberry, and medium tannins on the finish. Light bodied.

- #446A. **CASTELLO DEI RAMPOLLA Chianti Classico (Greve (Tuscany), Italy)** 154
One of the earliest adaptors to biodynamic farming in Tuscany for more than 30 years. Notes of dark chocolate overripe blackberry and silky tannins.

- #678. **CASCINA IULI "La Rina" (Montaldo di Cerrina Monferrato (Piedmont), Italy)** 84
Made from an almost extinct grape, this wine is full of ripe cherry, strawberry, raspberry and dried herbs. It does retain enough weight to keep it from being just a warm weather drinker.

sumoll

- #281. **CLOS LENTISCUS "Litrona: Sumoll" (Penedes (Catalonia), Spain)** 100
Hand harvested, 5 days of skin maceration & aged in amphorae. Bright and fresh, higher acid. Blue fruit, fresh hay, herbaceous with grippy tannins. A touch of funk.

syrah

- #110. **WOLF AND WOMAN (Swartland, S. Africa)** 75
Wild violet flowers and bright dark berries jump out of this glass, fresh cracked black pepper on the finish with grainy tannins.
- #320. **NATASHA WILLIAMS "Lelie Van Saron" (Aarde Valley (Western Cape), S. Africa)** 97
A seductive experience. Cassis and black cherry dance on the tongue with violet and rose petals lingering slowly in front of the herbaceous and peppery finish.
- #311. **OCHOTA BARRELS "Where's the Pope?" (McLaren Vale, S. Australia)** 130
A savory, well structured Syrah with black fruits and herbaceous qualities. Bright, smooth tannins with cherry, plums and violet dancing on the tongue.
- #601B. **SAMI-ODI "Little Wine 12" (Barossa Valley, Australia)** 292
A blend of 8 different vintages going back through 2015. We are very lucky to see anything from Sami-Odi as his wines are so limited. Notes of cocoa, plum, cardamom and dried orange.
- #601A. **SAMI-ODI "Our Hill" (Barossa Valley, Australia)** 420
This may be one of the most extraordinary wines that Frazier McKinley has ever made. The vineyard site is near his house and some of the vines are very old. Black plum, roasted fig and a hint of cedar tempranillo

- #324. **VIÑA SASTRE Ribera Del Duero Crianza (Rioja, Spain)** 125
A powerful drinker, dark red fruits, amarena cherries, vanilla, oak and dark cocoa.
- #474. **DOMINO DE PINGUS “Flor de Pingus” 2018 Ribera Del Duero (Rioja, Spain)** 220
*Full bodied and loaded with chewy, fresh tannins. Dark berries, dark chocolate, well rounded and an all around perfect wine for red meat. **OWNERS' PICK***
- #563. **NUMANTHIA “Termanthia” 2011 Toro (Valdefinjas (Castilla y Leon), Spain)** 360
A full bodied, big, powerful red wine. Dense and muscular, yet polished and refined.

Rich, with juicy, fresh berry fruits and notes of violet and lavender. Dense, yet bright with approachable tannins and dark forest fruits.

trousseau

- #451A. **DOMAINE DE SAINT-PIERRE “Le Dos D’Chat” Arbois Rouge (Corvées (Jura), France)** 134
Although this wine does not come from his vineyard, the process by which the farming happens is the same method that Fabrice would use in his own estate. A bit easier drinking with notes of black pepper, ripe cherry and a bit of wet steel in the finish.
